






Our chronic team have been working extremely hard: we've seen an increase in visits due to new arrivals to the camp, high temperatures and complicated cases.

The hot weather has a major effect on our patients, and presents a number of challenges. Temperature-sensitive medications must be safely stored, meaning that our patients who use insulin must make more trips to the pharmacy - where we have a fridge.




We were lucky to welcome $\mbox{\rm Dr}$ Robin back to the dental clinic last week, where he treated a huge number of patients.

The demand for our dental services are still incredibly high: people leaving the island are not sure when next they will have a chance to see a dentist, so they come to see our team and attend to any issues before their departure, and new arrivals often have dental issues and come to the clinic soon after they get to Lesvos.

We have not been able to keep the clinic open at all times because we don't always have a dentist available.









Following some changes with the organisations we were collaborating with in our central pharmacy project, we are now sole suppliers for the pharmacy.

The population of the camp is growing - we have seen more arrivals than departures, and therefore it is critical that we are able to keep up with the demand












Today, we're kicking off Refugee Week 2022.




We need some dental volunteers for our clinic over the summer, providing emergency dental care for the men, women and children in RIC Mavrovouni, Lesvos.




Hypertension is one of the most common chronic illnesses we have seen in our chronic care clinic since the inception of our organisation.

There are a number of factors which affect a patient's blood pressure, including diet,

the weather and stress - the environment in the camp is often unpredictable, and this sometimes makes it difficult to stabilise the blood pressure of our patients.

Dr Nasos: "What we witness here it that many of our hypertension patients don't respond to the classical medication that is normally prescribed. It takes studying and patience to find the right treatment for them."






Following the devastating news which has been dominating our headlines over the past few weeks, Anne (CMA's program manager) went to Poland and Slovakia to conduct a needs assessment and determine whether our expertise would be needed in the emergency response there.

We have gained a plethora of experience providing sustainable healthcare to people on the move, and understand that our knowledge of standard operating procedures and problem-solving may be useful to those setting up and coordinating response for Ukrainian refugees.

Following extensive travel along the border, and speaking with the organisations which have already begun responding to the crisis, it was determined that at this point we were not needed at the first point of arrival for Ukrainian refugees. We will be conducting a second assessment now that there are established systems and gaps can be correctly identified. We remain on hand to provide any support, advice or resources to any organisations currently operating in the region, and will continually assess the situation to ensure that as and when we are needed, we will be ready to respond.














Today, the Greek Orthodox church begin their celebrations for Easter.






We are excited to launch our first-ever Ramadan fundraising campaign. We are looking to raise money which will go towards the operating expenses of our






The cold weather did not let up - meaning that our patients living in the camp were exposed to extreme conditions, and we saw a number of emergency cases come


We're shining a light on our incredible team members by introducing who they are and the amazing work that they do for us every day.




This International Women's Day the theme is #BreakTheBias - highlighting the need for us, as a society, to work towards celebrating diversity and inclusion and gender equality.

YOUR HELP IS NEEDED!




Today, 11 February, is recognised as International Day for Women and Girls in Science.



Abdoulaye, Anne and Radwan were recently invited to speak to graduate students at the Harvard Kennedy School, the Harvard T.H. Chan School of Public Health, the Harvard Law School, as well as other schools within the Harvard network for the learning program established by Claude Bruderlein (of the Centre of Competence on Humanitarian Negotiation - CCHN) and his team - the focus of the course is considering the synergies between public health, emergency humanitarian assistance, migration's impact on climate and environmental hazards, urban conflict, human rights, and other relevant domains.


Our team were excited to share their experience working in the context of the camp here in Greece. Abdoulaye, CMA Field Coordinator: "As asylum seekers in some countries in Europe, we do not have access to universities, participating in such activities, allows us to learn and somehow provide our modest contribution by sharing our personal experience.


The contribution of our team was well received, Harun Khan - physician and student of this course: "It was an absolute pleasure to interview Anne and Abdoulaye from CMA about the complex reality of caring for vulnerable migrants on the ground in Lesvos. They provided an invaluable insight for researchers, like ourselves, at Harvard"

We believe in the importance of research and academic studies, and know that exchanging information and linking of field workers and researchers allows us to learn from each other and enriches our knowledge, therefore better support for those in need is provided.

Opportunities like this may also spark an interest in students who have the potential to contribute to the sector in a field-based role in the future, and we are thankful to have been a part of it









2 years into the worldwide COVID-19 pandemic, the CMA team is still making adjustments to our operations to ensure that the safety of our patients and staff are prioritised and that government recommendations and restrictions are adhered to.

Our most recent challenge, in light of the Omicron wave which is now affecting Europe, has been a shortage of volunteer dentists being able to come to serve patients in our clinic - this has resulted in the clinic needing to be shut for a few weeks meaning that there is currently no emergency dental care being provided in




