

**Minutes OXY Camp Management Meeting 13 November 2015**

Theme	Summary of discussions	Action points
Blankets	Blankets should not be reused and be taken along on busses down to camps; reuse places health risk. Sleeping bags have preference, but not sufficiently available. Cases of scabies and numerous cases of chicken pox have been reported. Those involved must be reminded of importance of letting people take blankets along. This could be made easier with straps/bags. Alternatively they might be washed chemically in Anaxos.	<ul style="list-style-type: none"> <li>- Throwing away of blankets that are left behind</li> <li>- Ensure that all blankets are taken along to camp by communicating necessity with beneficiaries, volunteers, busloaders, drivers</li> <li>- DTF will look into providing straps or bags to make blankets portable</li> <li>- Potentially blankets could be washed</li> </ul>
Transport for medical & vulnerable cases	Need for additional transport for medical and vulnerable cases. So far, private transport needs to be arranged.	<ul style="list-style-type: none"> <li>- Health partners have recommended that additional medical transport be provided</li> </ul>
Data collection	IRC has collected data from people entering bus since Oct. 10. Some busy days have been missed. Data provide demographics of beneficiary population as well as referral statistics.	<ul style="list-style-type: none"> <li>- IRC will share data with partners</li> <li>- It was suggested that data was matched with HCR outgoing data to check how accurate the data are</li> </ul>
Referrals & transport	Getting vulnerable cases on buses can be difficult on busy days. Not whole family can be taken down to bus.	<ul style="list-style-type: none"> <li>- IRC will make division of referral cases in high/medium/low priority and share this with partners</li> </ul>
